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Variations Permitted in the Accelerated BSBA

1. The accelerated BSBA allows for the choice of up to 2 specializations.
2. An accelerated BSBA student essentially has to complete at least 3 of the 4 following requirements.
 - a. Enter with 2 approved Advanced Placement courses: not limited to Calculus and Foreign Language as shown in the sample
 - b. Take an overload their first year (1 additional course in both fall and spring semester)
 - c. Take 2 classes in the summer after the first year
 - d. Take 2 classes in the summer after the second year

The listed scenario on the previous page allows the student not to over-elect in their first year. This would help them get set up for success and not get overwhelmed the 1st year. However, a student can choose to do an overload in their first year and opt out of either the first year or second year summer classes. This would help them save money by skipping one summer of classes, and free up more time for an internship.

3. ***The academic path is only a sample path, so a student has the flexibility to take a course in a different semester than as listed on the path, as long as the course requirements and prerequisites have been met. Refer to the following chart for the list of requirements and prerequisites.***
